



# CO 82 IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT GLENWOOD SPRINGS TO CARBONDALE

## JUNE 17-23 TRAFFIC UPDATE

Guardrail replacement, which requires lane closures along the eastbound/upvalley side of Colorado Highway 82 is ongoing throughout July. Work areas are progressing with crews working towards Carbondale. Please use both lanes until the merge point. Delays are anticipated. Remember, go slow for the cone zone.

Utility work at mile point 5 (exit for Old State Hwy 82, see image) is ongoing for the next several weeks. Motorists should anticipate shoulder closures in the area and a closure of the eastbound/upvalley right-turn pocket onto Old State Hwy 82. Follow signage and flagger instruction.

Approximately June 17-21, local eastbound/upvalley traffic wishing to access Old State Hwy 82 should follow detour signs for alternate access at the next intersection (Thunder River/CMC intersection).



### Ongoing Road Impacts

Motorists should anticipate stretches of shoulder closures, lane closures, reduced speed limits and narrowed roads during daylight hours. Delays are anticipated; please allow extra travel time through the area.

Construction hours are 6 AM to 9 PM on weekdays. Please see below for information regarding lane closure restrictions.

### Lane Restriction Hours

In order to minimize impacts to the traveling public, there will be no lane closures during the morning peak for the eastbound/upvalley lanes (towards Aspen, 6-9 AM) or during the afternoon peak for the westbound/downvalley lanes (towards Glenwood Springs, 3-7 PM).
